helped organize the violent shut down of the Milo Yiannopoulos event at the University of California, Berkeley on Wednesday is backed by a progressive charity that is in turn funded by George Soros, the city of Tucson, a major labor union and several large companies.

The Alliance for Global
Justice, based in Tucson, is
listed as an organizer and
fiscal sponsor for Refuse
Fascism, a communist group
that encouraged left-wingers
to shut down the
Yiannopoulos event.

The call to arms succeeded.
 Yiannopoulos' talk was cancelled after demonstrators lit fires, vandalized businesses, and assaulted Donald Trump and Yiannopoulos supporters.

Refuse Fascism, which includes Princeton professor Cornel West as one of its founding "initiators," defended the response, issuing a statementon its website that called the shut down "righteous."

And on its Facebook page, the group asserted that the vandalism and arson were not "violence." Instead, the group argued that Yiannopoulos and Trump perpetrate violence through the policies they support.

"Dismantling police fences is not violent. And to compare preventing someone like that from speaking to the real-world violence that they perpetuate everyday is ludicrous," reads one post on the group's Facebook page.
